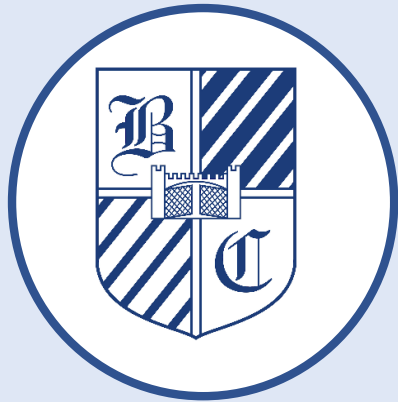

Thanks for all your cooperation, feedback and support again this week. Have a lovely long weekend – enjoy the sunshine, but hopefully a little cooler too!

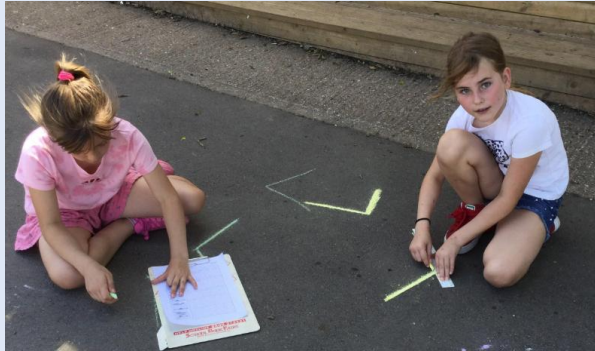

What's Happened this Week

Year 4 Outdoor Learning Day

On Friday 19th June, Year 4 enjoyed an exciting Outdoor Learning Day. During the morning, the children visited our local woodland, Walkwood, where they developed their geography fieldwork skills by observing how the area is used by members of the local community. Later, the children took part in an angle hunt around the KS2 playground, identifying, drawing and creating a variety of angles in a practical and engaging way. To finish the day, the children used their creativity and imagination, inspired by our class text *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, to write and perform poems about stepping through the wardrobe and into the magical world of Narnia.



Year 4 DT Cooking Day

On Tuesday Year 4 put their cooking and nutrition skills into practice by creating delicious jam tarts and stuffed peppers. As part of their Design Technology learning, the children explored the importance of seasonal food and discussed how fruits and vegetables grown at different times of the year can be fresher, tastier, and kinder to the environment. The children loved preparing their dishes and learning more about healthy food choices. They enjoyed tasting their jam tarts in school, while their stuffed peppers were taken home to be baked and shared with their families. Despite the hot weather, all pupils showed fantastic resilience and perseverance throughout the cooking experience. Well done, Year 4!



Year 1 RE Lesson

In Year 1, we have been learning all about Judaism in RE. We made challah bread and enjoyed a picnic featuring foods that are symbolic in the Jewish faith, including challah bread, honey, apples, and pomegranates. The children loved baking the bread and sharing the special feast together.



Year 3 Trip to Twickenham Stadium

We enjoyed an incredible behind-the-scenes tour of the stadium, including a look inside the players' dressing rooms and a special visit to the Royal Box. The children were amazed to see where some of rugby's greatest moments have taken place. We also took part in a fascinating workshop exploring how rugby kits have changed over the years, learning about the evolution of the sport through time.

A highlight of the day was our visit to the World Rugby Museum, where we saw the iconic Webb Ellis Cup and learned all about England's historic victory in the 2003 Rugby World Cup. It was a brilliant day filled with learning, history, and inspiration, and Year 3 represented the school brilliantly throughout.



Year 6 'Wicked' Theatre Trip

Year 6 braved the heat on Wednesday as they travelled into London to watch *Wicked* at the Apollo Victoria Theatre. We were amazed by the spectacular set, stunning costumes, and outstanding performances from the talented cast. 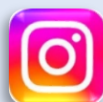
